Welcome back to Term Two. I hope you have enjoyed some family time and had an opportunity to discuss your child's Individual Learning Plan and organise your child's needs for school including uniform, devices and upcoming events. Thank you to the parents/carers who connected at our Learner Review meetings on the Primary Campus in the last week of Term. 71% families attended or logged in to discuss their child's progress and how they can support learning at home which was a wonderful outcome. Parents/Carers who could not attend either the Primary or Secondary Campus Learner Review meetings will be contacted to make arrangements for follow up.

Our College has a clear focus on high expectations and this begins with school attendance and punctuality. As parents/carers you have a key responsibility in this regard. It is imperative that your child attends every day and comes with the necessary equipment, food/water, charged device and texts/stationery to ensure they are able to perform at their best and to have a positive and engaging day. Student experiences at school are predetermined by parent/carer attitudes and expectation as much as student expectation.

The following SIX items have been prioritised to address the essential needs in preparation for school:

1. A clear routine regarding movements and punctuality to and from school
2. Appropriate uniform and pride in taking care of oneself and the lovely school grounds and facilities
3. A discussion every evening surrounding learning needs and student responsibilities for their learning plan including homework and assessment
4. Access to student timetables (via Compass)
5. Access to Student Individual Learning Plan (transitioning to Compass)
6. Access to events calendar to prepare for school events, excursions/incursions/sports (via Compass)

I would like to credit Mr Abney-Hastings and Ms Lee for their incredible work, fortitude, networking and resourcefulness for enabling our College curriculum to be ready for enactment to begin this term.

The following works have occurred over the holidays:

- New carpets in the VCE building and Secondary Campus General Office
- CCTV Installation on the Primary Campus and extension of the CCTV network on the Secondary Campus
- New concrete paths ready in time for the winter on both the Primary and Secondary campuses.

I am immensely proud of the progress our students have made academically, socially, and emotionally. Yes, there are always bumps along the way, but your unwavering support and partnership have been invaluable in creating a nurturing and enriching learning environment for our students and as a school, we look for to this continue throughout the Term.

As we embark on this new Term, I want to assure you that our commitment to providing a safe, supportive, and stimulating educational experience remains our priority. I encourage you to stay engaged and involved in your child's education journey. Communication between home and school is essential, and I welcome your feedback, questions, and suggestions.

COMMUNICATIONS - COMPASS

This Term will see the Primary Campus communications shift significantly for both students and families. Our uptake of Compass on the Primary Campus has been outstanding thus far, and we expect to see full integration of the platform throughout Term 2. This will enable access to calendars, timetables, excursions, interviews, and learning plans, as well as assessment and reporting via Compass. If parents/carers are having any issues accessing Compass, please come in to the school and speak to us for support.

STAFFING IN TERM 2

2024 FEEDBACK SESSIONS

Thank you to our 2024 Prep families who came into school on the last day of Term 1 to give their feedback about our school, how they have settled in, things that are going well and anything that may need some tweaking. The overwhelming response was very positive especially around our small class sizes, our

transition program and Prep teaching team. We will be running a Year 1-6 feedback session for families later in the Term for interested families. More information to follow across the next few weeks.

This Term will also see the College opening the Secondary Campus to prospective students and families entering Year 7 on Tuesday 23rd April for a 2025 Year 7 Information Night.

YEAR 5 TRANSITION PROGRAM

This Term we will begin our transition program for Year 5. This will see Year 5 students remain on the Secondary Campus on a Friday (after 5/6 sport) to complete their Health and Wellbeing program. In addition, for the last week of Term 2, the Secondary campus will welcome Year 5s to further experience life a secondary student and provide opportunities to trial some of the specialist offerings available. More information will be sent out to Year 5 families leading up to the end of the term.

FACILITY UPGRADES

We have had a number of improvements across the holiday break with a new path now in place for students entering and exiting the school via Lakes Boulevard. This will ensure a safer journey especially when it gets wet in the winter months. You will have also seen a new electronic gate for the staff carpark. This will support safety for students and staff when entering and exiting the carpark. Regarding safety, CCTV has also been installed across our Primary Campus over the holiday break. Sadly, we continue to have out of hours activity where a number of items become smashed or broken. Replacement of these items comes at a great cost to our school and hopefully the installation of cameras will support the responsible use of our school grounds.

A very warm welcome back to all students, staff and families on the Secondary Campus.

COMMUNICATIONS - COMPASS AND VERSO

This Term will see the Secondary Campus Communications shift significantly for both students and families. Our uptake of Compass on the Secondary Campus has been outstanding thus far, and we expect to see full integration of the platform throughout Term 2. This will enable access calendars, timetables, excursions, interviews, learning plans and assessment and reporting via Compass. Additionally, over the Term we will be seeing daily Campus communications, previously the Campus Bulletin, shift to Compass news, allowing students to access important updates so that they can plan their day ahead. Because of this, it will be essential that students have access to Compass on their laptops (and on their phones for outside of school access).

Additionally, Verso, a tool used to activate student voice for teacher reflection and measurable school improvement will be integrated across all Domains this Term.

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGIES

This Term, student laptops will have Class-cloud Management software enabled - an essential and additional tool to eliminate distractions and ensure that learning is prioritised. This software, approved by School Council, allows teachers to monitor student access to the internet whilst in class, allowing them to retain student focus on the task at hand and block distractions during learning time, e.g. watching YouTube or accessing gaming.

Many students have been curious about this software, however have acknowledged the benefits of this being used during school hours to support a focus on learning. Moving forward, students who do not have this software installed will not be able to use their device at school. Any student who has not yet had the software installed should see Mr Karevski or Mr Skaria for support.

Great news for the College on the back of the very successful She Maps (Women in STEM) Incursion in Term 1! The team at She Maps were so impressed by our female students that they recommended our College to Systra, one of the world's leading engineering and consulting groups, who have generously donated a DJI Tello EDU microdrone class kit, enabling The Lakes to create impact in promoting STEM subjects and careers to female students.

2025 INFORMATION EVENINGS

This Term will see the College opening the Secondary Campus to prospective students and families entering Year 7 on Tuesday 23rd April. Additionally on this evening we will also hold an information session for all current Year 9 families as students prepare themselves for Senior School in 2025.

SUBJECT SELECTION

Term 2 on the Secondary Campus sees the 2025 subject selection process begin. Beginning in Week 3, students in Year 8, 9, 10 and 11 will have the opportunity to begin to select subjects for 2025 that align to their career and pathway plans. It is important that students meet important deadlines around this process, and understand the choices and pathways available to them, particularly as they enter Senior School. YEAR 5 TRANSITION PROGRAM

This Term we will begin our transition program for Year 5. This will see Year 5 students remain on the Secondary campus on a Friday (after 5/6 sport) to complete their Health and Wellbeing program. In addition, we will welcome Year 5 to the campus in the last week of Term 2 to support their transition to Secondary schooling by providing them with opportunities to trial some of the specialist offerings available at the Secondary level of schooling.

STAFFING IN TERM 2

RHYTHM REVIVAL

Rhythm Revival will take place for the College on June 6th. This will showcase all of the efforts that Semester 1 Arts students have made throughout the first half of the year. This will be the first time that our Song, Dance and Drama evening will be held offsite at Plenty Ranges Arts and Convention Centre. We look forward to seeing you there!

SENIOR SCHOOL EXAMS & GAT

In the later portion of the Term, our Senior School students will begin their mid-semester exam period. This involves the General Achievement Test (GAT) for ALL students in Year 12, and subject-based exams for all students in Years 10-12. The College will be supporting students to instil strong study habits and examination preparation ahead of this period. To support the exam conditions that are required during this time, classes held in the Arts wing will be moved for this examination period and bells will be turned off during this time.

ASSESSMENT & REPORTING

Assessment and reporting throughout the Term will be ongoing, with CAT marks posted to Compass for review. Mid-Semester reports for Years 7-9 will be published in the last week of Term 2, and Year 10-12 reports will be published in the first week of Term 3 to allow time for examination marks to appear on mid-semester reports.

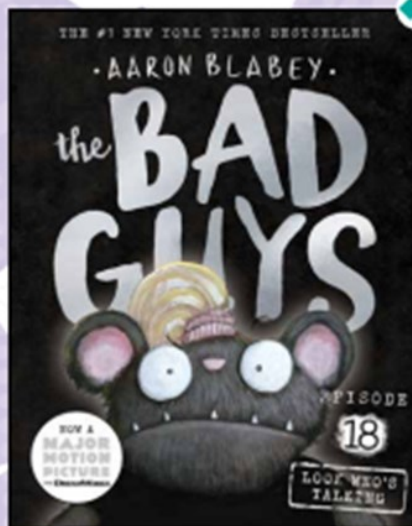
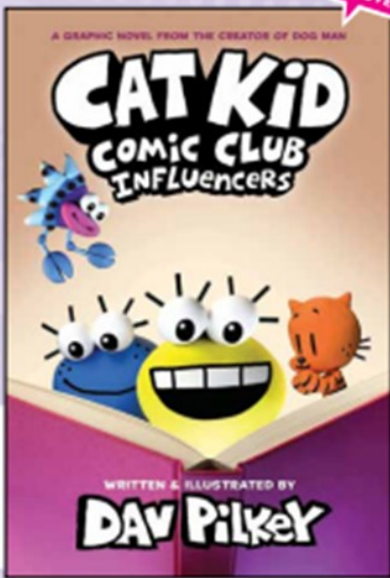

The College has transferred from Sentral to Compass Education as the communication portal for our College as of Term 2, 2024. The College has made this decision on the grounds that Compass offers a superior product and better meets our education needs (see below regarding the suite of products).

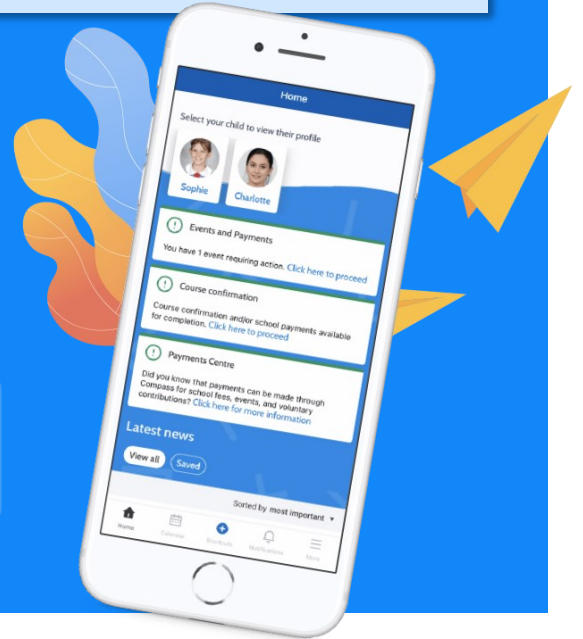
By now you should have received an email with your family login. Please ensure you have setup your account so that you can maintain communication and give permission for upcoming events.

How do I access Compass?

Compass is accessible on any modern web browser (Internet Explorer, Firefox, Chrome, Safari) or by using the Compass iOS or Android apps (continue reading to learn more about the app including how to use it).

To access the parent portal, you can go to your school's website and click the Compass link on their homepage. Alternatively, you can go to schools.compass.education where you can search for our school's direct URL.

To log in you will require your unique family username and password. These details will be provided to you by our school. Upon first login, you will be required to change your password and confirm your email address and mobile phone number. These details may be used by our school for SMS, password recovery and email communication throughout the year.

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COMMUNITY NOTICEBOARD

ATTENDANCE - EVERY DAY COUNTS

If you are aware that your child will not be attending school due to illness or other circumstances, please contact either office to ensure our attendance records are accurate.

Ways of communicating absences include:

- Placing a future Absence Request through the Parent Compass Education Portal;
- Calling the office;
- Sending an SMS on 0427 226 537

As required by the Department of Education, all schools must notify parents/carer informing that their child is absent. Please inform the office of absences before 10:00 am each morning.

BELONGINGS, AMBULANCE & INSURANCE

Private property brought to school by students, staff or visitors is not insured and the Department of Education does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage.

Parents and carers are reminded that the Department of Education does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and carers of students who do not have student accident insurance/ ambulance cover are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance/ transport and any other transport costs.

CSEF (CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND)

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps, and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card, or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$150.00 for eligible primary school students and \$250.00 for eligible secondary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

It is important that funding made available in 2024 supports students to participate in school trips, camps, and sporting activities this year rather than being held for future years. This funding can also be used in conjunction with any funding accrued from previous years.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the Primary Campus office on 9404 9000 or Secondary Campus office on 9401 9419 and ask for an application form.

You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page.

Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

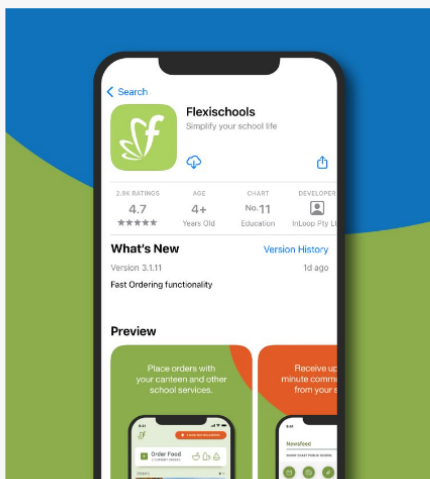

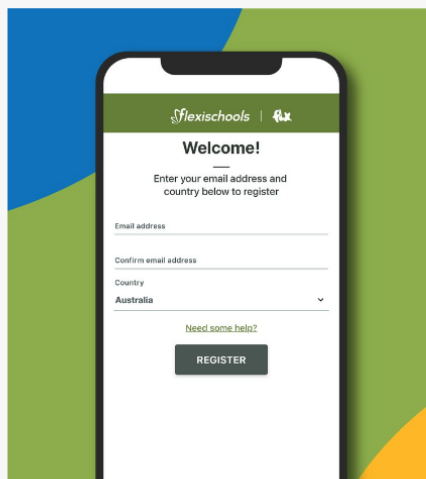

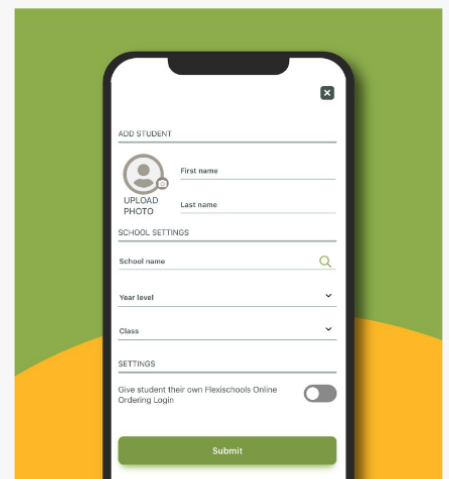
1. Download our app

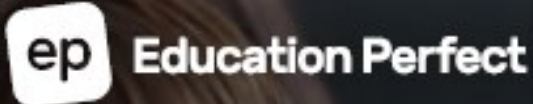
